I am pleased to let you know that the first half of 2006 has been very positive. TriMas Corporation completed the first six months of 2006 with revenue of \$552.7 million. Our operating income for the period was \$60.8 million or an increase of 12.1% over 2005. This strong performance is a direct result of the dedicated and proactive efforts of each of you throughout TriMas. It is our belief, with your continued support, we will experience positive results during the remainder of this year. Our earnings growth will allow us to continue our focus on debt reduction which, in turn, will only serve to strengthen our Company.

Cequent Launching New Fold-Away Brake Actuator

Cequent Performance Products recently introduced a new Fold-Away Brake Actuator. The new hinge system allows for longer pivoting and is much stronger than conventional hinges. This new actuator will allow 32" of the trailer tongue to fold away. This is 50% more pivoting length than Cequent's previous model. This new product will be plated with Z-Max 600hr clear zinc finish providing for excellent corrosion protection.

The Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002

In response to a number of major corporate and accounting scandals in the late 90's and early 2000's, the United States passed a federal law called the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002 (commonly called SOX). The legislation established new and enhanced standards for all U.S. public company boards, management and public accounting firms. The main purpose of SOX is to improve investor confidence in financial statements issued by public companies. The rules require officers of a public company to certify that they are responsible for establishing, maintaining and regularly evaluating the effectiveness of the company's internal controls.



Each business unit within TriMas has been diligently working on processes, procedures and controls to meet the SOX compliance requirements. Internal auditors from the corporate office, as well as external auditors, are visiting business unit locations to test our financial controls. Your cooperation is a key element to our success in this important endeavor.

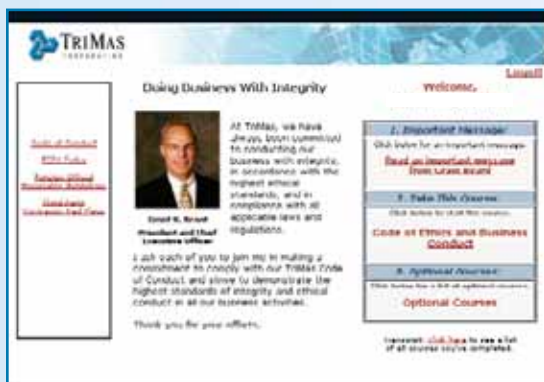
From the Legal Department...

Code of Ethics and Business Conduct – Updates

TriMas recently adopted the following revisions to its Code of Ethics and Business Conduct:

1. Clarified that employees of European business units should limit employee hotline data use to accounting and financial matters.
2. Expanded discussion of the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, including adoption of foreign official hospitality guidelines.
3. Updated policies regarding international sanctions, trade embargoes and export controls.
